NO NEED TO MOVE WEST!





Our client spotlight is focused on the Hill/West family. Mary Hill and her husband purchased their home off Eastwood Road in 1974. They raised their two daughters there and watched Wilmington change over the years, although they never got around to changing their home until recently. Unfortunately Mr. West is no longer with us, but Mary, her daughter Audra and her husband Kenny, recently had Avocet Design Build complete a lifelong dream to renovate the house. It was a first-floor renovation to include the main living area, kitchen, laundry room, hall and the addition of a deck. The goal was to remove an old fireplace, add a slider and deck, and open up the smaller spaces to an open-air plan which modernized the kitchen and laundry area. Our design aesthetic was a clean, Swedish feel incorporating a blue and white color palette while drawing in outdoor elements by choosing natural materials for lighting and two beautiful Sapele wooden slat walls to section off the spaces of the eating area and entryway and utilizing wallpaper to bring everything together. Audra's tendency toward excellent organization added to the finished project with neatly stacked and labeled items inside the cabinets and a lovely sense of adding family heirlooms to the finished space to create an amazing end product. Avocet didn't forget the furry friends in their lives either and installed doggie doors, a doggie ramp on the deck, and a special cabinet just for feeding bowls and supplies. I've been waiting and waiting ever since my new client, Elizabeth, told me this book was coming out and I pre-ordered my copy. Well, last week it finally arrived! Blue and White Done Right: The Classic Color Combination for Every Decorating Style by Hudson Moore and Mario Lopez-Cordero, published by Monacelli Press. This book is an exploration by the iconic Schumacher Design House to explore the legendary color scheme which has roots in Chinese and Dutch heritage. It also features products that are rated best-in-class from fabrics, to tabletops and wallcoverings. It's been divided into chapters by style; modern, charming, boho, traditional, etc and is 132 pages long. It gives inspiration to interior design with the transformative view of blue & white.







The best part of making a frittata surrounding the holidays is that it's a different way to utilize leftovers of any combo for cheese, meats and veggies. The choices are endless as the base stays the same. Create a turkey and sweet potato one with caramelized onions or a Christmas one with ham, asparagus and a touch of stuffing on the side.

Preheat the oven to 375
A cast iron skillet that is 10" or 12"

- 8 eggs
- 1/4 cup sour cream
- 1/4 cup water
- 3/4 cup finely grated cheddar cheese
- Chopped onion
- Finely chopped sweet potato
- Tomato
- Chopped basil



Place the skillet on top of the stove and turn the burner to medium-low. Whisk together eggs, sour cream & water, and most of the cheese in a large bowl, set aside. Saute onion and potatoes for 5 minutes. Add tomato and basil, and saute another 5 minutes. Pour egg mixture over top and place in oven for 20 minutes. Take out of the oven, sprinkle remaining cheese on top, and let rest for 10 minutes before serving.
