This exquisite French design was a natural collaboration between homeowners, Gigi and Steve and Avocet Design Studio. Gigi has a natural sense of design and brings her innate French style to everything she touches.

We were looking for something bold and classic that would exemplify their Forest Hills home. To do so, we chose a beautiful combination of Benjamin Moore paint in the colors Stokes Forest Green that adorns the main cabinetry, and Sea Salt Green as our accent.

Kitchens from the 1970s were generally small and compartmentalized, a design trend most often used during this time period. The design challenges that needed to be solved included proper ventilation for the large Viking gas range, a better flow for entertaining guests and a clever design plan to fit in completely modern kitchen appliances.



The paneled Viking refrigerator creates pleasing aesthetics, with custom panels matching the cabinetry for a seamless, built-in appearance.



The Viking double wall oven offers increased cooking capacity and flexibility allowing multiple dishes to be prepared at different temperatures simultaneously ensuring the entertainment of many friends and family.



We finished this highly stylized look with handpatterned tile, *Angela Harris Florista Protea Leaves Mural*, that delivers the lavish feel of hand-painted wall paper, while ensuring the durability and easy maintenance tile offers.

Steve loves to cook delicious meals using a variety of seasonings. Chris strategized custom pull-out drawers to hold Steve's innumerable spice collection, as well as creating an intentional keeping place for informal meals.

Custom smoked glass mirrors were also added to some of the cabinetry enhancing the rich finishes.
